Beginning Friday, Aug. 14, The Dialog will once again be publishing and delivering to parishes its regular print edition. It's the first in-print version of the newspaper since mid-March as restrictions were put in place to limit the spread of coronavirus. As with other "reopen" efforts, we are taking a cautious approach to this restart. We had already been in the process of a circulation audit, asking parishes to provide a most accurate number of newspapers needed at your parish. We will be reducing the number of papers sent to you based on the audit and on what we know about the number of people who have returned to church inperson. Also, we are aware that parishes may not able to hand out copies of the newspaper. We would ask only that you try to stack the newspapers in a prominent place near exits and alert churchgoers to their presence beginning the weekend of Aug. 15-16. Our online efforts at thedialog.org have proven very popular during this difficult time as our web traffic has increased three- and four-fold. We are grateful for the chance to help keep people informed over the web - and we will continue to do so. But we are also very happy to return to print. Aug. 14 will be a **keepsake edition.** It will include the graduation section that we typically publish with the newspaper in June. It will also include a "look back" at all the news and developments that occurred during the heaviest span of the coronavirus pandemic.
