
# JULY 14, 2024

#### 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time



In today's first reading we hear Amos, the prophet describe himself as "a shepherd and a dresser of sycamore trees." God chose him to be a prophet to the northern kingdom of Israel. But he was a native of the southern kingdom of Judah. Amaziah the priest in the northern temple of Bethel tells him to shut up and go back to his southern kingdom. At the time Israel was enjoying great prosperity but not pleasing God. They did not like to hear Amos' call to repentance. Since they refused to listen to God's prophet, in the year 721, the kingdom of Israel was conquered by the Assyrians and many were taken into exile. In today's Gospel, Jesus sends His apostles out to preach His Word and call people to believe in Him. St. Paul today reminds us we have all been chosen by God to be holy, filled with His love and now He expects us to bring His Word and love to others.
