In the ancient world of the Scriptures, shepherds had a very intimate relationship with their sheep. (Much like the relationship of many today with their dog or cat).

They knew the strengths and weaknesses of each of their sheep. They slept in the fields with them. The Lord used that image of the shepherd in today's first reading from Jeremiah the prophet. He reprimanded the false shepherds who failed God's people and now they were suffering in exile in Babylon. But God assured His people He had not abandoned them. He would care for them, gather them from exile and give them another descendant of King David to reign over them (the Messiah.)

We see Jesus in today's Gospel calling His apostles away from the crowds to a "deserted place" to be refreshed. But Jesus saw the crowds who followed them as "sheep without a shepherd." Jesus, the Good Shepherd, continues to care for us and show us His love and mercy.
