Third Sunday of Lent

Each year on this Third Sunday of Lent the person of Moses appears in our Liturgy. Moses, living about 1,200 years before Christ, is the giant of the Old Testament. He is used by God to bring His People out of their slavery in Egypt and lead them to the Promise Land. This year we hear Moses telling Israel (and all of us) the Ten Commandments. On Mount Sinai the Lord established His Covenant with His People. The Lord would bless them and protect them. For their part in this 'marriage' the people would obey God's commands. Jesus in the New Covenant is the new 'Moses'. As the Son of God made man, He is intimately united with His Father in heaven. He is shown to us driving the money collectors out of the holy temple of Jerusalem. In the holy season of Lent, Jesus continues to cleanse His new Temple, the church, of all that defiles it. We are called to let Jesus cleanse us of our sins.

This year, Reconciliation Monday will be held on March 25th. All parish churches in Delaware and Maryland's Eastern Shore will be open for confession from 3:00 until 8:00 pm.

Lenten Guidelines

<u>Prayer:</u> We urge you to make the effort to participate in the daily Masses of Lent.

<u>**Penance:**</u> We are encouraged to do something difficult to strengthen our will-power to resist sin and temptation.

<u>Abstinence:</u> All Catholics from age 14 on are expected to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent.

<u>Fasting:</u> All Catholics from age 18 to 59 are expected to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means **ONE** full meal a day: two other light meals, no snacks between meals. These are minimum expectations. The Church as our Mother encourages us to do something so we can share the dying of Christ in order to rise with Him at Easter to New Life.

Works of Charity: We are challenged by the Church not only to open our hearts to God but to one another. Reach out to help the needy.

The Rice Bowl: This campaign of the American Catholic Church is an effort to help our hungry brothers and sisters. We are asked to have one simple meatless meal each week and give what we save to help the hungry.

Lent began as a time for the Church to prepare those who wished to join the body of Christ through the Easter Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. Please pray for people throughout the world preparing to receive these sacraments in the Easter Season.
