THE BISHOP WANTS TO HEAR FROM YOU!

The Bishop has begun a process of long range planning beginning with hearing from the "grass roots." All parishes, gathered together in their deaneries, are invited to participate. One of the realities our Diocese must face is the declining number of clergy to serve our parishes. In 2007 we had <u>93</u> priests in parish ministry. In <u>2015</u> the number was 81; in 2023 we have only 69! Ten of these priests could retire but continue to serve; in 5 years, 10 more priests will reach retirement age. If all in seminary continue to ordination, we can look forward to only 5 new priests. The number of people participating in Sunday Mass has also decreased 42% from 2007. One of the questions we have to face is whether neighboring parishes can share together some ministries or services.
