This week on Saturday, services were held at Holy Child to remember the unborn. The two contrast each other, because one is so joyful and the other so tragic. And no one alive at the time of 911 will ever forget it either. It was a day that could have torn our country apart, but instead we as a country united and watched over and prayed for each other. One thing that did happen was that people returned quickly to Church, and to God. You couldn't find a seat in any church and the confession lines were long and steady. Instantly, lives were changed.

People were having that moment that many of us have not had yet, the moment when we realize how precious life is. We experienced it then and again during Covid. But the responses were totally opposite. This virus, meant for killing, got lose and changed the whole world, not just America. But the churches did not fill, they were empty. We were locked out.

Sadly, when the doors of the church were reopened, many turned away from God, away from receiving Holy Eucharist and ultimately away from eternal life. To think that one evil act caused such pain and suffering is beyond understanding – but so was thinking that the twin towers would crumble. What is it going to take to turn things around? It is going to take us working in union with God. By now many of you have tried everything in the book to get your family and friends to come back to the church. We collectively forgot something, the power and authority of GOD! I think it was St. Francis that told his followers to go out and preach the gospel, but he added **use** words if you have too. You have tried everything, the nagging, prodding, and shaming did not work. Some of you still think today that you need to pester God, you don't, He hears you and sees you - let Him do the work and let's get out of His way. The past three years we as church have been concentrating on the Eucharist. We know it has power beyond all human understanding. Offer the grace of Eucharist for your loved ones and friends, God will give you more, your cup will overflow with His grace. Share your Eucharistic grace with everyone. 911 was for many a moment when the words, "Don't give up / Don't give in" came to life. Let's apply this to our church, our families, our friends, and our nation with God. Let's watch and see God work, with us, through us and around us. May God be praised now and forever.
