# SEPTEMBER 22, 2024 25<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

In high school, Gardiner Area High School to be specific, I was a manager for the football team. A new coach had arrived on the scene a year earlier, and he had some different ways of approaching coaching and teaching the game. During my sophomore year, he sat us down as a team and asked us to elect captains. We thought the seniors on the team would be the captains. My recollection was that "coach" told us to elect captains that would be a leader on and off the field and would build up the football program and the high school.

He wanted us to elect a person that saw the bigger picture. We did and surprised everyone. Two underclassmen, led by example, they helped players struggling with their homework, and they helped the managers pick up the field after practice. They regularly picked up trash on the grounds of the school when they thought no one was watching. Yes, they made mistakes, but they admitted when they were wrong and took responsibility. They taught us humility. They inspired everyone around them by caring for the team and not being selfish or self-centered. That year and two years later the team went to the state championship and won it.

When Jesus is talking to his disciples, he is telling them the same thing. Don't worry about being the greatest, but make sure that everyone is treated with love and respect no matter who they are or where they are from. That very challenge exists for us today. Men and women, many diverse groups make up our church and community - they need us, and we need them. Some need financial help, but more need to be listened to and loved for who they are, and they want our prayers, not our pity. Today, both rich and poor alike, die of broken hearts and loneliness. Some of the richest people I have met in this world dress like poor people, they volunteer in thrift stores and at food banks and distribution centers. And they are happy, not because they have all the money they need, but because they get to make a difference. Why do you think the tv show, "undercover boss was so popular," the boss saw and helped his employees and the community.

Everyone matters to God, even those of you that think you don't - you do! Look at His Son, he was born in a barn, laid in a food trough, and labored as a boy and later as a man with his father Joseph as a carpenter. He prayed to His father daily and took his advice to heart. He did as his father instructed him. He practiced what he learned growing up and led by example. He spoke as his father told him and yes, when it came to making the ultimate sacrifice for us, He made it. Dear God, we pray, Help us to lift up all your children, Oh God. Help us build your divine Kingdom here on earth, Oh God. Help us to see your face in everyone, Oh God. Help us to be a light in the darkness, Oh God. Show us how to forgive and how to forgive ourselves, Oh God. Protect us from evil, Oh God. Teach us how to others in new and sometimes unconventional ways, Oh God. You have blessed us with your Kingdom Oh God, help us to make your Kingdom come here on earth.

May God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be praised and glorified forever
