
# <u>January 14, 2024</u> 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time



The Church calendar says it is the "Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. But the Scripture we hear today are not "ordinary." We hear the story of the calling by God of Samuel – the last of the Old Testament "judges" or leaders of God's people. His response, "Speak, for your servant is listening" is still true of every believer in God. In the Gospel we hear Jesus being "manifested" by John the Baptist: "Behold the Lamb of God." The first of the disciples have listened to the voice of God and responded, following Jesus, the Lord and Savior.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity starts January 18<sup>th</sup> (the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul). All Christians are invited to pray together that full unity may be restored to the Church of Christ. Pray that <u>all</u> may be <u>one</u> in the Church of Christ.

Phone calls fielded in November - 183 Food Pantry assistance - 49 families in November and 50 families in December.
